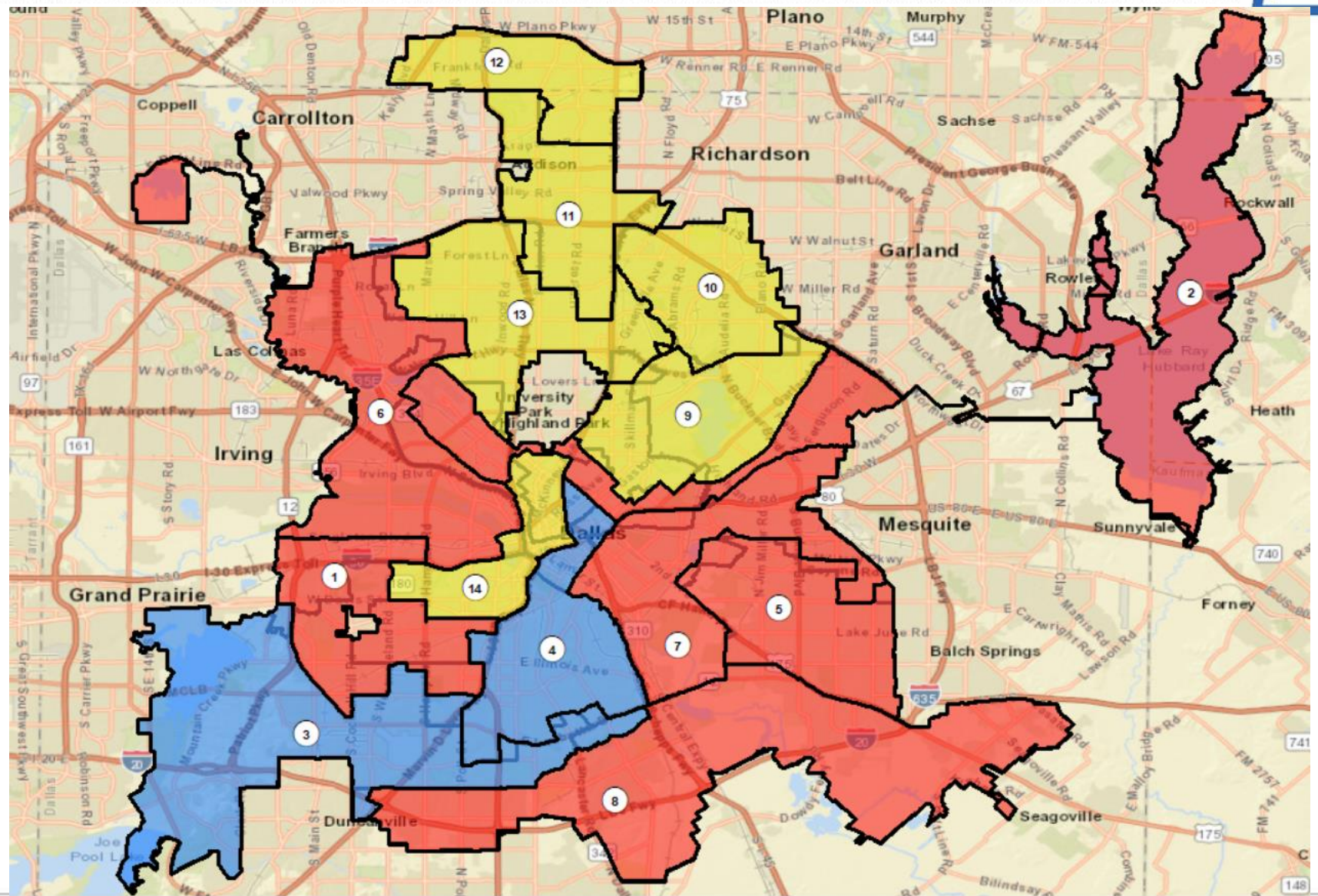
- The Commissioners are encouraged to review all map plans that have been submitted for the week, as some submitters may decline to present.

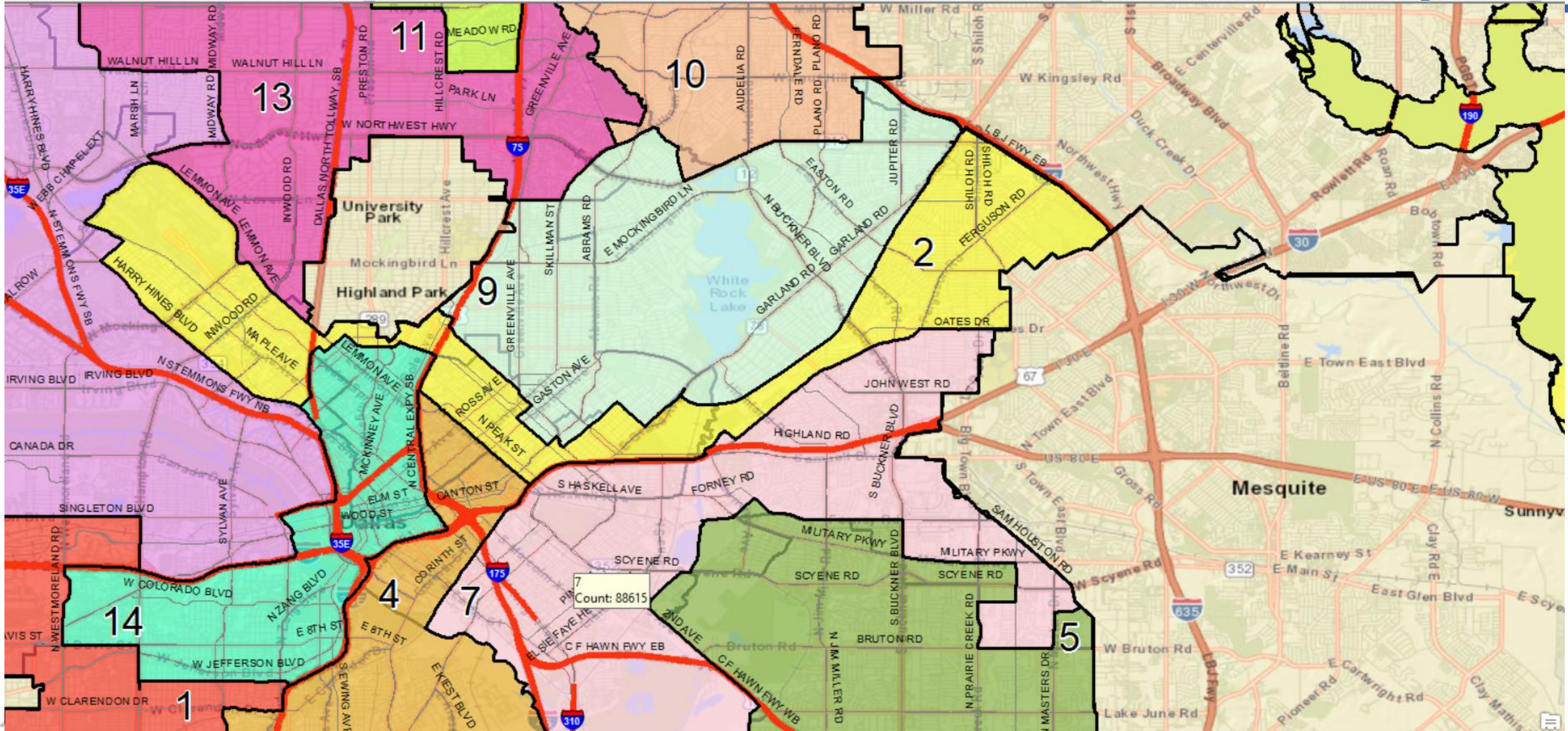
Map Submittal Update – COD-017-RB-BS-RL

- # of neighborhood associations split – 41 out of 443



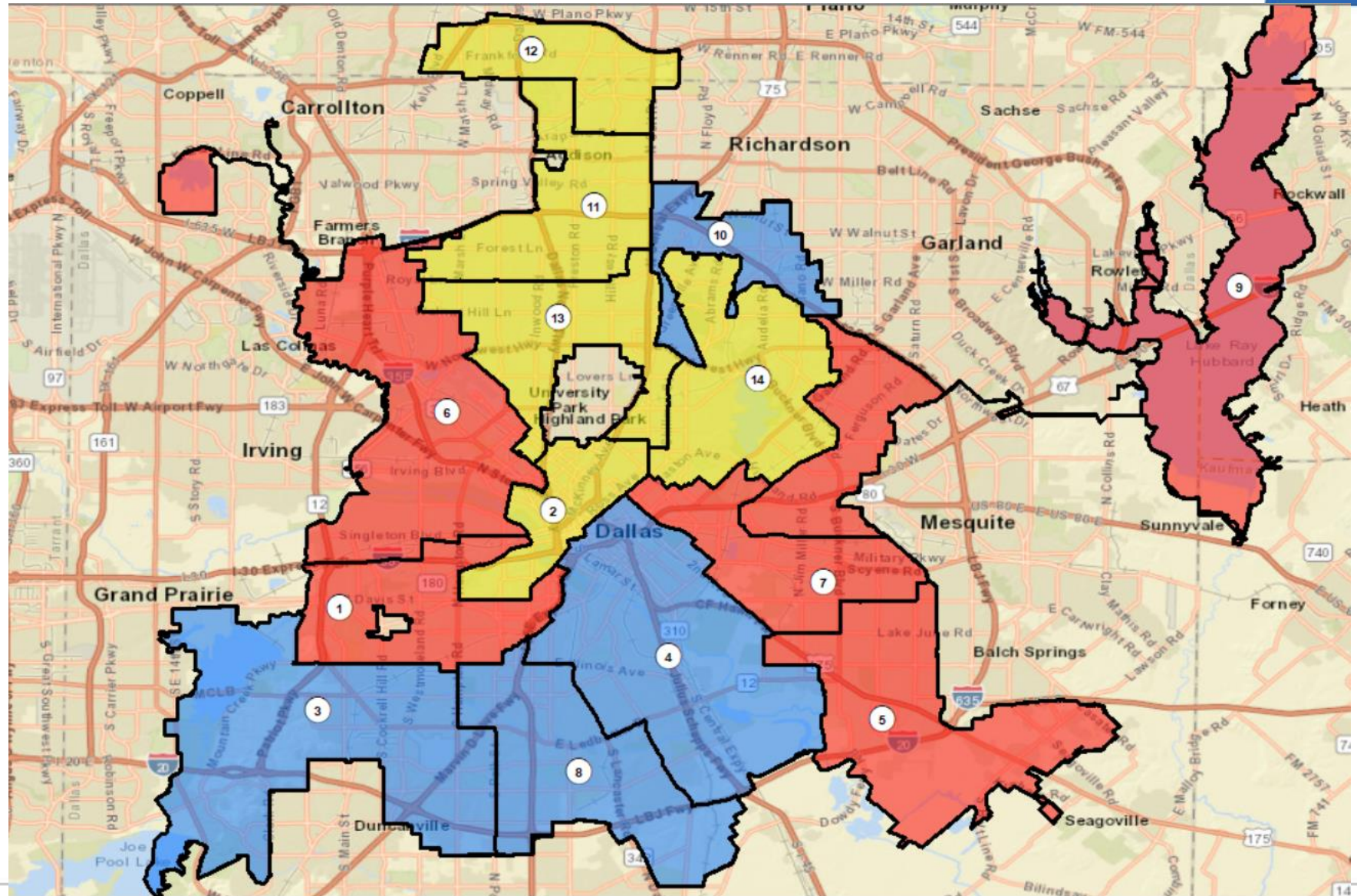
District 2 has an interesting shape



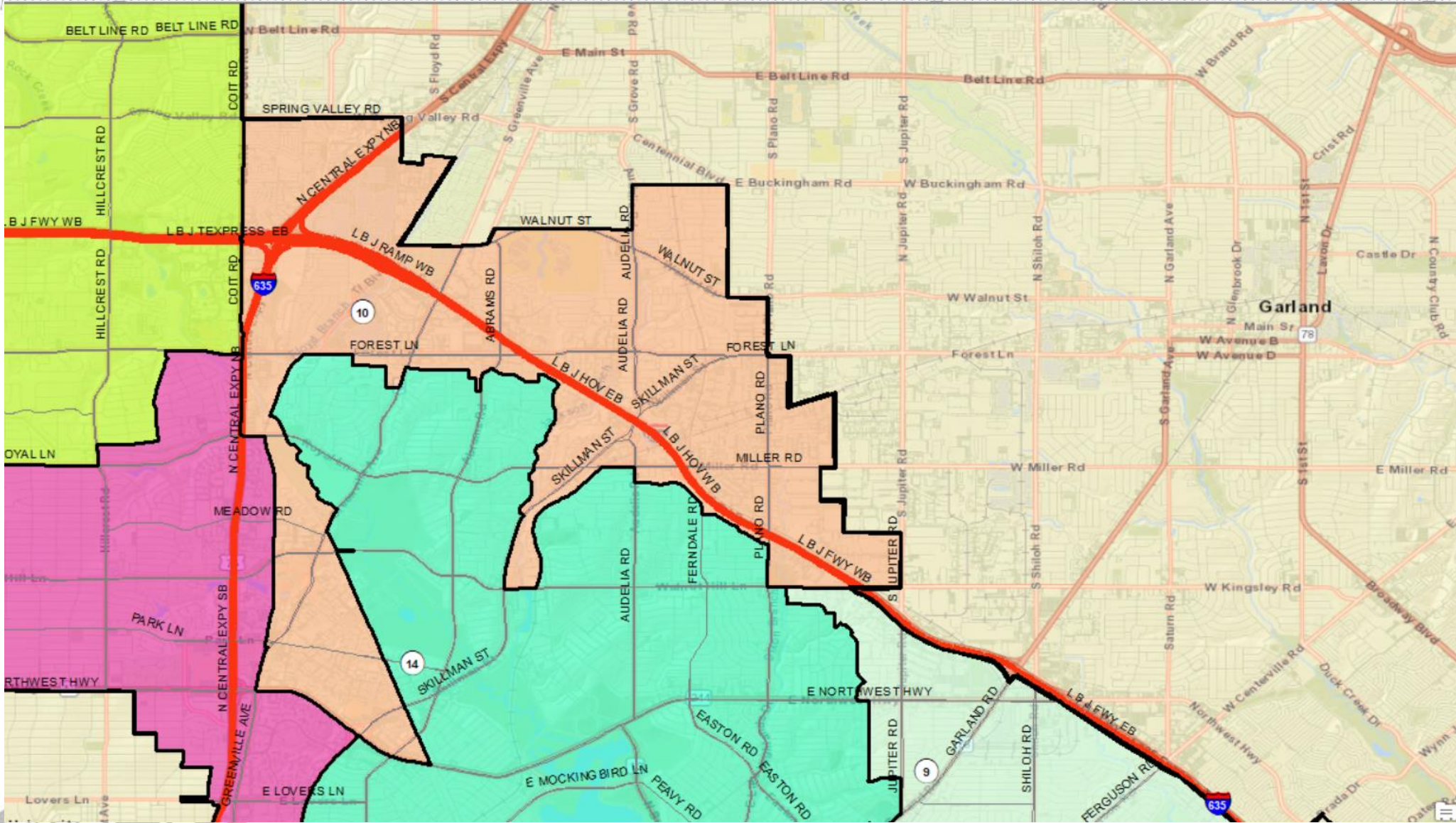

- # of neighborhood associations split – 48 out of 443



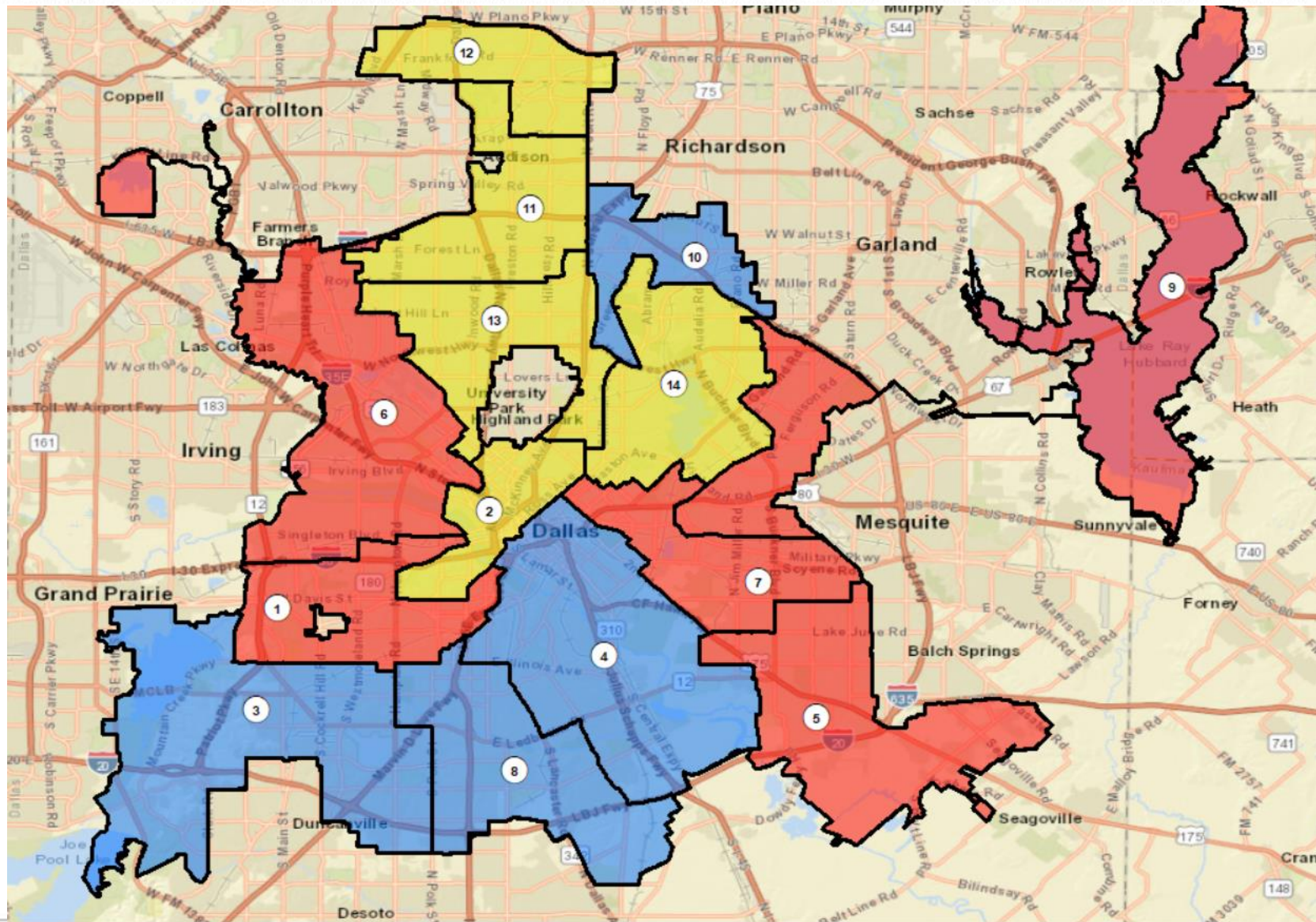
District 10 has an interesting shape



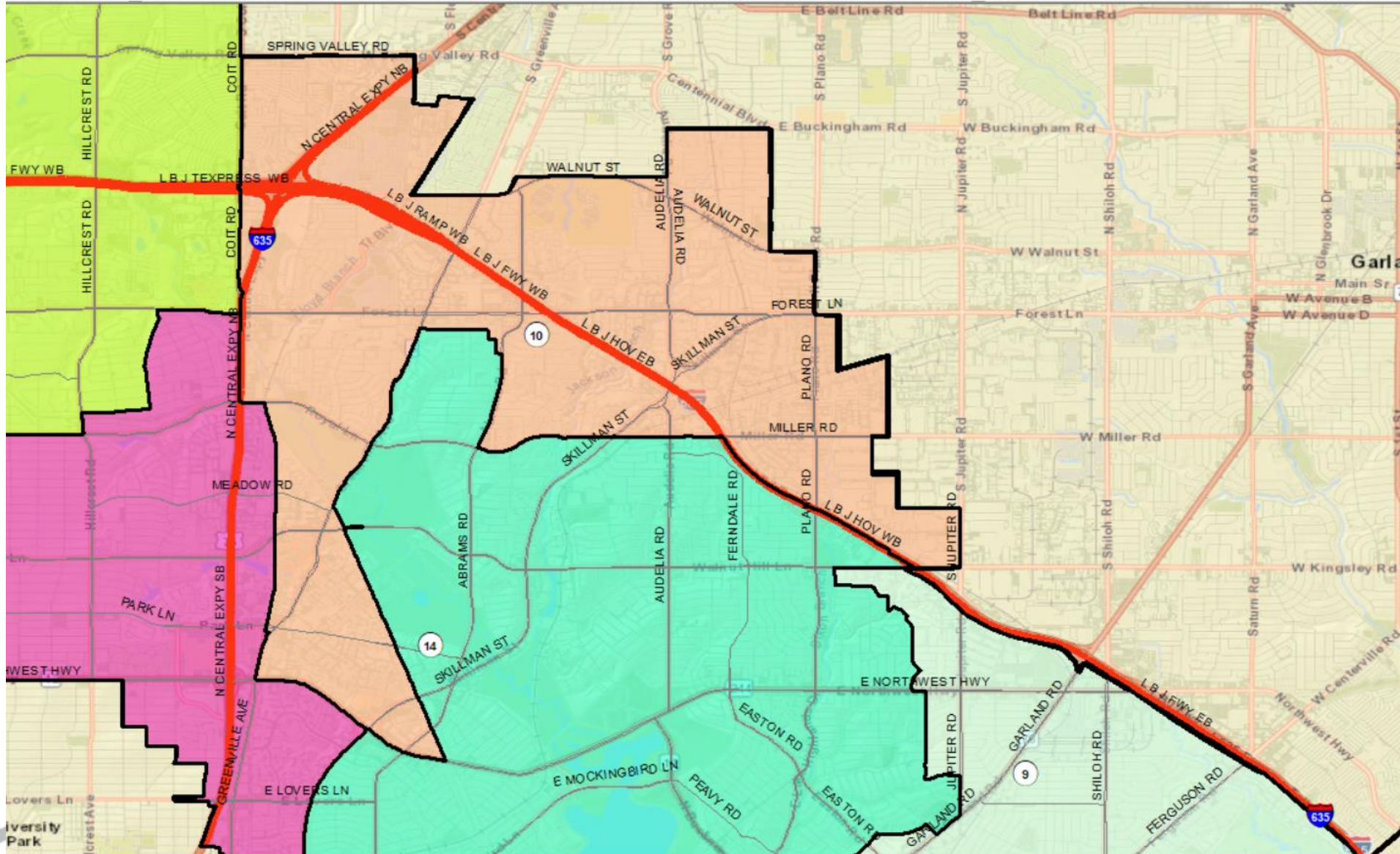

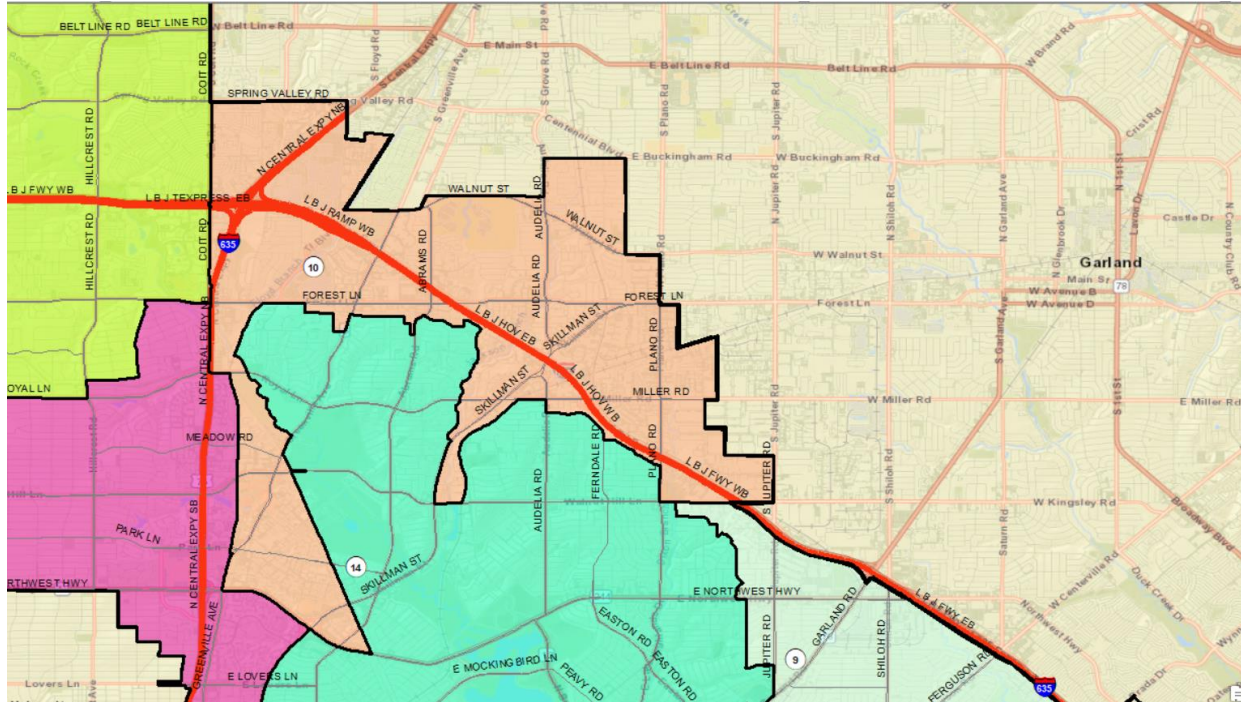
District 10 has an interesting shape



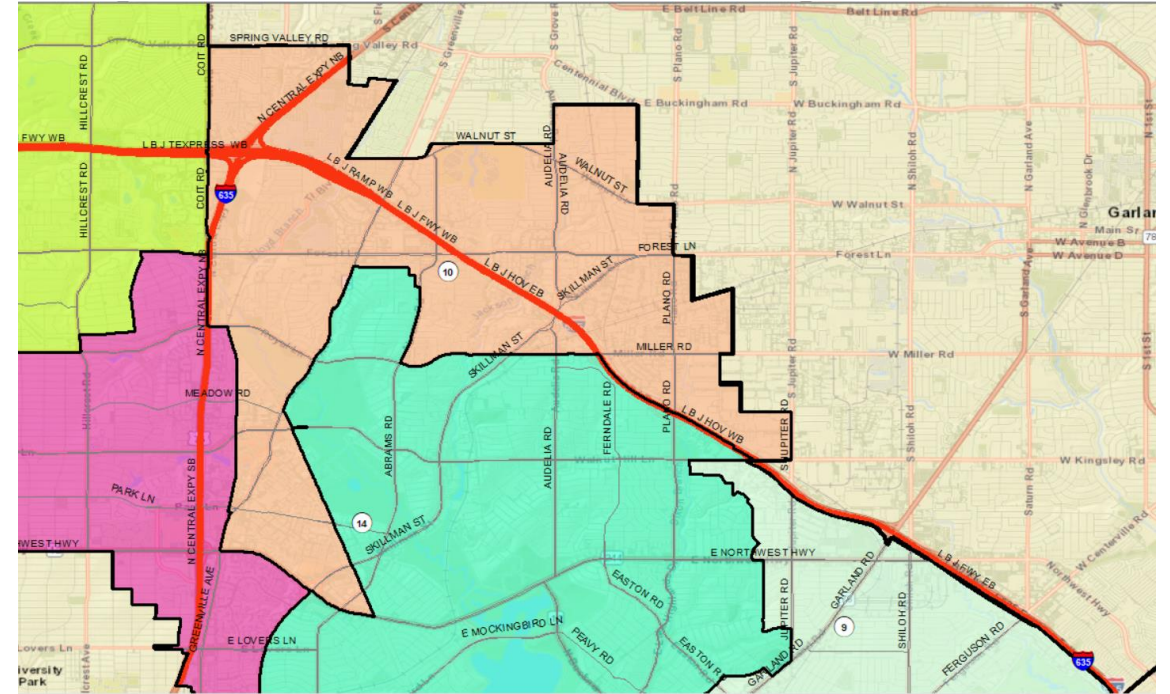
Difference between COD-18 and COD-19

Map Selection Process & Approval

FIRST MAP SELECTION MEETING: Top 10 Plans



1. Plan submissions that the Commission have voted to add to the inventory will be placed on a matrix, which will be distributed to each Commissioner for their consideration during a regular meeting.
 - Commissioners may select up to 10 plans but may not allocate more than one point to a particular plan.
2. The total value assigned to each plan will be tallied during a meeting recess.
 - Upon completion of the tallies, the meeting will reconvene and the 10 plans receiving the most points will be reported to the Commission for further consideration. However, should there be less than 10 plans receiving points, only the number receiving points will move forward.
3. Each Commissioner will have an opportunity to discuss the plans on the list of plans moved forward for further consideration during a two-round debate. Commissioners will be allotted five minutes during the first round and three minutes the second round.



Map Selection Process & Approval

FIRST MAP SELECTION MEETING: Top Three Plans (cont.)



4. Once the debate is over, each Commissioner will receive a ballot to vote on their top three plan submissions.
 - Commissioners will not be required to select three plans, but they will not be allowed to select the same plan more than once.
5. The top three maps will be tallied during a short meeting recess, and then results will be presented when the meeting reconvenes. The three plans that receive the most votes are considered the top three plans.
6. Commission meeting adjourns.



Map Selection Process & Approval

SPECIAL MEETING: Public Input Session



7. The Commission holds a public hearing to receive public comment on the top three maps.

- Commissioners must decide when to host this public hearing. As of now a public hearing is tentatively planned for Saturday, May 21, 2021; however, this might be too late if we start voting in early May.
- We may consider having a public hearing on Saturday, May 7, 2021.



Map Selection Process & Approval

SECOND MAP SELECTION MEETING: Top Two Plans



8. During the next Commission meeting, Commissioners may amend each of the three final plans by making motions for changes. When a motion is approved, ARCBridge Consulting Inc. will make the approved changes live, during the meeting. The Commissioners will then review the amended maps to assess the resulting impact on the population numbers, compactness & contiguity, neighborhood/precinct and other communities-of-interest boundaries, and packing/cracking.
9. After amendments are made, each Commissioner will have an opportunity to discuss their favored map(s), from the top three selected plans, during a two-round debate. Commissioners will get five minutes the first round and three minutes the second round.
10. Once the debate is over, each Commissioner will be asked to rank the top three plans from most-liked to the least-liked.
11. The two plans that received the most first choice votes move forward, and the remaining plan will be returned to the Commission's inventory.



Map Selection Process & Approval

THIRD MAP SELECTION MEETING: Final Plan Approval



12. The Commission will decide if they want to have another public hearing to receive public input. If the Commission decides another public hearing is not warranted, the Chair will ask for a motion for approval of one final map.
13. If the Commission decides to hold an additional public hearing, motions on approval of a final map will be made at the Commission's next regular meeting. The Commission will debate the motions via the regular process.
